We do this by providing educational programs and scholarships, as well as ongoing support as they move through the educational system.

As one of the initiatives in support of our mission, the MCWT Foundation has partnered with Ferndale University High School and Lawrence Technological University to establish a MCWTF Student Interest Group (SIG).

The objectives of the SIG are

- ? Advise SIG members of MCWTF scholarship opportunities and computer technology competitions and functions
- ? Attend SIG meetings and special functions when possible
- ? Become a part of the SIG member's professional network

- ? Act as liaison between FUHS and the SIG, ensuring the SIG conforms to foundation and university guidelines for student organizations
- ? Assist in the planning and organization of SIG events
